Principal's report

Vice Principal's report

- Friendship day was celebrated on February 14 and students and staff dressed in pink, red and white
- February 22 is Toonie Tuesday. Donations can be sent via Cash Online or in plastic bags through the teachers.
- February 23 is Pink Shirt Day. Staff and students are invited to wear pink shirts to take a stance against bullying.
- February 25: Last Friday of the month is themed. Colours of the World. Staff and students are invited to wear colours to represent a country or city that they identify with.
- In the past few weeks staff and students have engaged in a lot of learning, discussions and dialogue around Black History Month. Teachers have been raising awareness about black history and how it relates to Canada. Staff also read the Advisory on Anti-Black Racism and how to protect staff and students from racism.
- The snow hills close to the parking lot are causing some difficulty as many students are climbing and running down them posing a challenge to bus drivers and staff in the parking lot.
