Note from the School Council Chair:*

The start of the 2022/23 school year saw a more normalized return to school activities. School Council meetings were once again held in person (with no hybrid option). Parent turn-out for the meetings was noticeably lower than in past years. A return to our normal school events saw an increase in the funds available for school use, although uptake from the teachers on the funding available was lower than in past years. The year-end school BBQ unfortunately had to be cancelled due to smoke from forest fires. Pizza lunches were able to resume as per usual.

Comments for the successor School Council:*

There were concerns expressed to School Council about the lack of activities offered during the school year i.e., extracurricular activities and field trips. Although School Council has funding available to support these types of activities, they are organized by teachers. It may be useful for School Council to flag early in the year to teachers that there is funding available through School Council to support these activities and encourage them to request funds as it was noted by a number of parents that the opportunities at Agincourt seemed to be fewer than at other schools. At several points throughout the 2022/23 school year,

School Council discussed finding additional ways to support Pinecrest Elementary (Agincourt Rd PS's sister school). In addition to supporting funding requests, the suggestion was made to better organize School Council's documentation with the aim of potentially sharing insights into the workings of a successful council.

As in past years, participation on the 2022/23 School Council was the same group of parents who have participated in the past. While some consistency is necessary, it would be good to encourage more parents to join and play an active role in School Council. There is certainly a sense of parent "Council-fatigue" from the dedicated parents who have participated for a number of years. We encourage the new Council to actively seek out ways to increase participation.
